

HAITI: CARE Earthquake Relief and Recovery

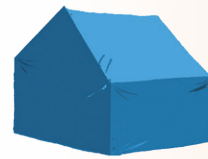

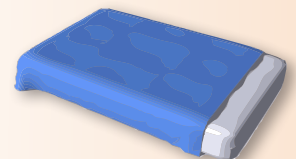
Food / Relief Items

CARE reached **290,000** beneficiaries through the distribution of tarps, tents, shelter kits, ropes, mattresses, blankets, kitchen sets, jerry cans, hygiene, clean delivery kits, newborn kits and food.

Families who received rice (in collaboration with World Food Program): **12,951** (5 persons per family)



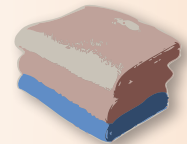

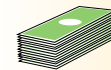

Transitional shelters built: **913**
(weekly average of 20-30)

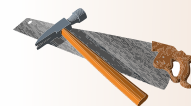


Costs of one transitional shelter: **US \$ 1,750**



Reinforcement kits distributed: **17,402**
(plus 414 wooden home repair kits)

Content of kits: wooden panels, tarps, iron sheets, nails, metal bars, straps and a flyer to explain how to do repairs



Water and Sanitation

Camps CARE currently works in: **51**

Latrines constructed: **1,027**

Hand washing stations: **89**

Showers: **342**

Children's and mothers' clubs to promote hygiene: **65**

Hygiene promotion sessions held: **3,077**

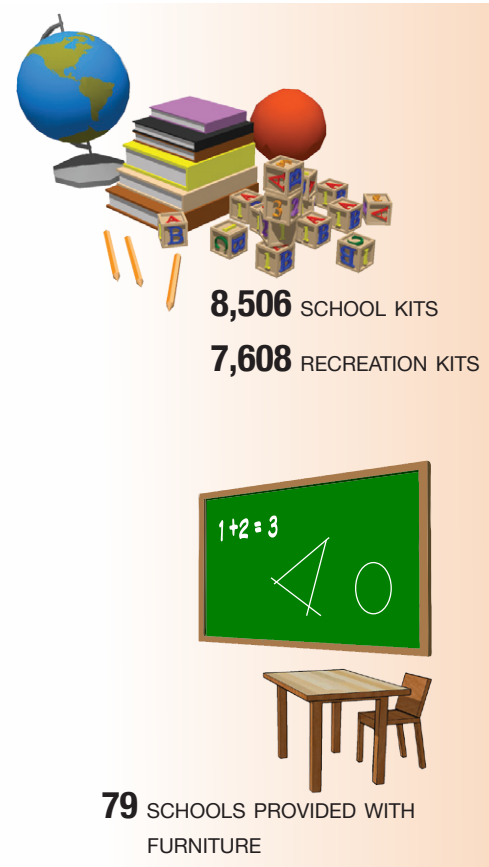
Parents participating in psychosocial training: **930**
